


15% of adults in the U.S. have chronic kidney disease.


People Living with CKD Compared to People Diagnosed with CKD

Most people are not diagnosed with **CKD** until stage 4 or 5 when it is too late to prevent **kidney failure**.³

People with **CKD** are more likely to die of a **cardiovascular event** than reach kidney failure.³
